

Your cellphone

I.I Keys and connectors







Prolonged exposure to music at full volume on the music player may damage the listener's hearing. Set your cellphone volume safely. Use only headphones recommended by TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates.



Send key

- · Go to the call log when you have missed call(s);
- · Pick up an incoming call;
- · Send an outgoing call;

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Menu key

 Open a list of actions which you can do on the current screen or the options menu.

Home key

- While on any application or screen, press to return to the Home screen.
- Press and hold to open the recently-used applications window.
- When the screen is locked and the backlight is off, press Home or Power/End key to light the screen.

Search key

Search information on the current screen or application.

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Q

Back key

 Press to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the notification panel, or onscreen keyboard.

Power / End key

- Short press: End a call During incoming call, refuse the call Lock the screen
- Long press: Show the pop-up menu to select Silent mode/Airplane mode/Power off

Volume Keys

- · When in call mode, adjust the earpiece or headset volume.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, adjust the media volume.
- In general mode, adjust the ring tone volume.



Navigation Keys

 Press the relevant direction (up, down, right, left) to navigate in various functions.

I.2 Getting started

I.2.I Set-up

Removing or installing the back cover



Installing or removing the battery

Please power off your cellphone before removing the battery.



- Insert and click the battery into place, then close the cellphone cover.
- · Unclip the cover, then remove the battery.

Installing or removing the MicroSD card

To insert the MicroSD card with golden contact facing downwards into the slot until it is locked. To remove, gently push the memory card until it is unlocked.





To remove the MicroSD card while the cellphone is on, you must unmount the storage card from the cellphone first (Press Menu key from Home screen, select Settings\ Storage\Unmount SD card), to prevent corrupting or damaging the storage card.

Charging the battery



Connect the battery charger to your cellphone and AC power outlet respectively.



To reduce power consumption and energy waste, when battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

1.2.2 Power on your cellphone

Hold down the **Power/End key** until the cellphone powers on. It will take a few seconds before the screen lights up.

Set up your cellphone for the first time

The first time you power on the cellphone, you should set your preferences: Language, KeyBoard, Mobile Data connection, Application Sync, System Updates, Date & time etc. Under the Options Menu.



This initial set up can be enabled via touching the Application tab from the Home screen and then touch JrdSetupWizard.

1.2.3 Power off your cellphone

Hold down the **Power/End** key from the Home screen until the cellphone options appear, select **Power off**.

I.3 Home screen

You can bring all the items (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) you love or use most frequently to your home screen for quick access. Press **Home** key to switch to Home screen.



Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to view the other home screen panes. Small dots at the lower left and right of the screen indicate which screen pane you are viewing.

Touch & hold the Application tab to display thumbnails, touch the thumbnail to open it. Press **Back** key to return to Home screen. You can customize the number of home screen panes by going to **Settings/Display/Home screen settings**.

1.3.1 Using the touchscreen

Touch ₹

To access an application, touch it with your finger.

Touch and Hold

To enter the available options for an item, touch and hold the item. For example, select a contact in Contacts, touch and hold this contact, options list will then appear on screen.

Drag 🥂

Place your finger on the screen to drag an object to another location.

Slide/Swipe

Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, images, web pages... at your convenience.

<u>Flick</u>

Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move quicker.

Pinch/Spread

Place your fingers of one hand on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.

Rotate

Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the cellphone sideways to have a better screen view.

I.3.2 Status bar

From status bar, you can view both cellphone status (to the right side) and notification information (to the left side). When the status bar is full, "

Notification panel

Touch and drag down the Status bar or press **Menu** key and touch **Notifications** to open the notification panel. Touch and drag up to close it. From Notification panel, you can open items and other reminders indicated by notification icons or view wireless service information.



Touch Clear to clear all event-based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain).

1.3.3 Search bar

The cellphone provides a Search function which can be used to locate information within applications, the cellphone or the web.

1.3.4 Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your cellphone and privacy, you can lock the cellphone screen by creating a variety of patterns or passwords, etc. Press Menu key from Home screen, select Settings\Location & security\Set up screen lock.

1.3.5 Personalize your Home screen

Add

Touch and hold an empty area or press **Menu** key and touch **Add** on the Home screen, you can add shortcuts, widgets or folders to the Home screen.

Reposition

Touch and hold the item to be repositioned to activate the Move mode, drag the item to desired position, then release. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen page.

Remove

Touch and hold the item to be removed to activate the Move mode, drag the item to the top of the trash can, which will then turn red, and release.

Wallpaper customization

Touch and hold an empty area or press **Menu** key and touch **Wallpaper** on the Home screen to customize wallpaper.

Home screen settings

Press the Menu Key from the Home screen and touch Settings\ Display\Home screen Settings to set the number of Home screens.

1.3.6 Application tab

Touch from the Home screen to enter applications list.

To return to the Home screen, press the Home key.

Recently-used applications

To consult recently-used applications, you can press and hold the **Home** key from the Home screen. Touch an icon in the window to open the related application.



1.3.7 Ringtone settings

You can set phone ringtone, notification ringtone and audible touch tones to your preference by pressing the **Menu** Key from the Home screen and then touch **Settings\Sound**.

1.3.8 Volume adjustment

You can set ringer, media and cellphone ringtone volume to your preference by touching the **Volume up\down** key, or press the **Menu** Key from the Home screen and then touch **Settings\Sound**.

I.4 Applications list

The Applications list contains all pre-embedded and newly installed applications.

To access the Applications list, touch **the Home** screen. To return to the Home screen, press the **Home** key.



2.I Using Hardware Keyboard



Fn key

- · Press once to input upper character.
- Press twice to lock upper inputting mode, then press once to unlock upper inputting mode.

Caps key

- Press once to enter the "Abc" mode: The first letter will be capital, after inputing the first letter, switch back to "abc" mode automatically.
- Press twice to enter the "ABC"mode: All letters will be locked as capital letters.

Space key

· Press to input space.

Delete key:

- · Short press: delete one letter before the cursor.
- · Long press: delete whole words one by one quickly.

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Symbol key

- Short press: display symbol box.

Enter key

- · Move the cursor to the beginning of the next line.

2.2 Using Onscreen Keyboard

Enable/Disable the onscreen keyboard

Press Menu key from the Home screen, select Settings\Language & keyboard\Soft keyboard switch, mark/unmark the Landscape mode or Portrait mode checkbox to enable/disable the Onscreen Keyboard.The keyboard won't display automatically in the portrait mode by default.

Onscreen keyboard settings

Press Menu key from Home screen, select Settings\Language & keyboard\TouchPal Input (or Standard keyboard), a series of settings are available for your selection.

Adjust the onscreen keyboard orientation


Turn the cellphone sideways or upright to adjust the Onscreen Keyboard Orientation. You can also adjust it by changing the settings (Press **Menu** key on the Home screen, touch **Settings\Display\ Auto-rotate screen**).

2.3 Text editing

You can edit the text you have entered.

- · Touch and hold text you want to edit
- · Options list pops up
- Select the operation you need (Select word, Select all, Cut, Copy, etc.)



3.1 Placing a call

You can easily launch a call using **Phone.** Enter this menu using one of the following two ways:

- Touch 🖌 or the 🕒 key from the Home screen.
- · Touch Application tab from the Home screen and select Phone.



Enter the desired number from the keyboard directly or select a contact from **Contacts, Call log** or **Favorites** by touching tabs, then touch of or the contact place the call.

The number you entered can be saved to **Contacts** by touching + or pressing **Menu** key and touching **Add to contacts**.

You can delete the incorrect digits by touching 🛥

To hang up a call, touch or press the 🤐 key.

3.2 Answering or rejecting a call



When you receive an incoming call, tap the green cellphone icon or press the key to answer.

When you receive an incoming call, but don't want to answer, you may decline it by tapping the red cellphone icon or pressing the set. The caller is sent directly to your voicemail box to leave a message.

3.3 Consulting your call log

You can access your call log by touching from the Home screen or touching key, and touching Call log to view call history in categories of Missed calls, Outgoing calls, and Incoming calls.



You can view and create contacts on your cellphone and synchronize these with your Email contacts or other applications on the web or on your cellphone.



When using Contacts for the first time you are required to add new contacts, and synchronize contacts from other application accounts to your cellphone.

4.1 Adding a contact

Touch Application tab on the Home screen, select **Contacts**, then press the **Menu** key from contacts list screen and touch **New contact**.

4.2 Importing , exporting and sharing contacts

From Contacts screen, press **Menu** key to open contacts list option menu, touch **Import/Export**, then select **Import from SD card** or **Export to SD card** or **Share visible contacts**.

To import vCard from a microSD card, touch **Import from SD card**, then you can choose to import one/multiple/all vCard files, touch **OK** to confirm.

To export all contacts to a microSD card, touch **Export to SD card**, then touch OK to confirm.

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Messaging, etc.

Touch a contact you want to share, press **Menu** key and touch **Share** from contact details screen, then select the application to perform this action.

4.3 Synchronizing contacts in multiple accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronized from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your cellphone.



You can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS with this cellphone.

To access this feature, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then select **Messaging**.

5.1 Write message

On message list screen, touch $\ensuremath{\textbf{New message}}$ to write text/ multimedia messages.

Sending a text message

Enter cellphone number of the recipient on **To** bar or touch of to add recipients, touch **Type to compose** bar to enter the text of the message. When finished, touch **Send** to send the text message.



An SMS of more than 160 characters will be charged as several SMS. Specific letters (accent) will also increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, slides and sounds to other compatible cellphones and e-mail addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides, etc.) are attached or subject or email addresses added.



Besides your Email account, you can also set-up external POP3 or IMAP email accounts in your cellphone.

To access this function, touch Application tab from Home screen, then select **Email**.

An email wizard will guide you through the steps to set-up an email account.

· Enter the address and password of the account you want to set-up.

- Touch Next. If the account you entered is not provided by your service provider in the cellphone, you will be prompted to go to the email account settings screen to enter settings manually. Or you can touch Manual setup to directly enter the incoming and outgoing settings for the email account you are setting up.
- · Enter the account name and display name in outgoing emails.
- Touch Done.
- To add another email account, press Menu key and touch Accounts then press Menu key again and touch Add account to create.

To create and send emails

- · Press Menu key from Inbox screen, and touch Compose.
- Enter recipient(s) email address in To field, and if necessary, press Menu key and touch Add Cc/Bcc to include a copy or a blind copy to the message.
- · Enter the subject and content of the message.
- Press Menu key, touch Add attachment to send an attachment to the receiver.
- · Finally, touch Send.
- If you do not want to send the mail right away, you can touch **Save** as draft or press **Back** key to save a copy.



To connect to the Internet with this cellphone, you can use CDMA / \mbox{EvDo} networks or Wi-Fi, whichever is most convenient.

7.1 Connecting to the Internet

7.1.1 CDMA / EvDo

The first time you turn on your cellphone, it will automatically configure network service: CDMA / EvDo auto.

To check and change the network connection you are using, press Menu key on the Home screen, then touch Settings\Wireless & networks\Mobile networks\Network Mode.

7.1.2 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi, you can connect to the Internet when your cellphone is within range of a wireless network.

To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Press Menu key from the Home screen.
- Touch Settings\Wireless & networks.
- · Mark/Unmark the Wi-Fi checkbox to turn on/off Wi-Fi.
- Touch Wi-Fi settings. The detailed information of detected Wi-Fi networks is displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (you may contact network operator for details). When finished, touch Connect.

7.2 Browser.....



To access this function, touch Application tab from Home screen, then touch $\ensuremath{\textbf{Browser.}}$

To go to a web page

On Browser screen, touch the URL box at the top, enter the address of the web page, then touch \rightarrow .

7.3 Connecting to a computer via USB

With the USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between your cellphone's MicroSD card and the computer.

To connect/disconnect your cellphone to/from the computer

To connect your cellphone to the computer:

- Use the USB cable that came with your cellphone to connect the cellphone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.
- · Open the Notifications panel and touch USB connected.
- Touch Turn on USB storage in the dialog that opens to confirm that you want to transfer files.

To disconnect:

- Unmount the MicroSD card on your computer.
- · Open the Notifications panel and touch Turn off USB storage.

To locate data you have transferred or downloaded in your MicroSD card:

- Touch Application tab from the Home screen to open the applications list.
- · Touch My Files.

All data you have downloaded is stored in **My Files**, where you can view media files (videos, photos, music and others), rename files, install applications into your cellphone, etc.

7.4 Connecting to Bluetooth devices (1)

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

To access this feature, press **Menu** key from the Home screen, touch **Settings\Wireless & networks\Bluetooth** or **Bluetooth** settings.

To pair/connect your cellphone with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your cellphone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- · Press Menu key from the Home screen.
- Touch Settings\Wireless & networks\Bluetooth settings
- Touch Scan for devices
- · Select a Bluetooth device you want to be paired with in the list.
- Enter a passcode (0000 or 1234)
- If the pairing is successful, your cellphone connects to the device.
- ⁽⁰⁾ You are recommended to use ALCATEL ONE TOUCH Bluetooth headsets, which have been tested and proven compatible with your cellphone. You can go to www.alcatelonetouch.com for more information about ALCATEL ONE TOUCH Bluetooth headsets.

8 Camera/Camcorder

Your cellphone is fitted with a Camera and a Camcorder for taking photos and shooting videos.

Before using the Camera or Camcorder, please ensure that a MicroSD card where all pictures and videos are stored is correctly installed. Also, be sure to open the protective lens cover before use to avoid it affecting your picture quality.

To access this function, touch Application tab from the Home screen and then touch **Camera** or **Camcorder**.

To take a picture

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, and touch icon to take the picture, which will be automatically saved.

To shoot a video

Switch Camera mode to Video mode or access Camcorder directly from the applications list. First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, and touch in the start recording. Touch in the start recording to the start recording to the suit be automatically saved.



With Telenav GPS, get all of the features of an advanced car navigation system on your mobile phone with voice turn-by-turn navigation enabled by GPS. Search for any destination including gas stations, ATMs, restaurants, and more. Get detailed maps of any location.

- In order to use Telenav GPS, you must first turn on your phone's location and GPS settings. (Press Menu key from the Home screen, touch Settings\Location & security\Use GPS satellites).
- · From the Applications tab select Telenav GPS.

From the Telenav GPS Home screen you can select:

- Drive To for turn by turn direction to an address, airport, contacts addresses and more
- Places to search for nearby businesses, the cheapest gas prices and more

 Maps & Traffic to see where you currently are located on a map and what traffic is in the area

Factory data reset

To activate factory data reset:

- · Press Menu key from Home screen
- Touch Settings\Privacy\Factory data reset
- Touch Reset phone

Cellphone reset will erase all of your personal data from internal cellphone storage, including information about your Email Account, any other accounts, your system and application settings, and any downloaded applications. Resetting the cellphone does not erase any system software updates you've downloaded or any files on your MicroSD card, such as music or photos. If you reset the cellphone in this way, you're prompted to re-enter the same kind of information as when you first started your phone.

When you are unable to power on your cellphone, there is another way to perform a factory data reset by using hardware keys. Hold down **Home** key and press **Power/End** key at same time until the screen turns into warning screen, then press **Home** key again.



With this cellphone, some built-in applications and other third party applications are available for your convenience.

With the built-in applications, you can

- · Communicate with friends
- Exchange messages or emails with friends
- Track your location, view traffic situations, search for locations and get navigation information to your destination
- · Download more applications from browser and more.

Using FOTA Upgrade tool you can update your phone's software.

There are two ways to access FOTA Upgrade:

Client Initiated:

Press Menu key, then touch Settings\About phone\Software update. Make sure your battery is charged or more than 20%, then touch Check for update and the phone will search for the available update. Your phone will automatically download update in background after it done.(Downloading update will only proceed in home network) Touch Now to complete the upgrade or Later to install later.

Network Initiated:

If your phone receive package notification from DM server in home network and battery is charged or more than 20%, package will be downloaded in background till download completed. Touch **Now** to complete the upgrade or **Later** to install later.

If your phone receive package notification from DM server in roaming network, you need to back to home network to download update.



All personal information will be permanently lost following the update process. We recommend you backup your personal data before upgrading.

Safety and use

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your cellphone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a cellphone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their cellphone when the vehicle is not parked. Check the laws and regulations on the use of wireless cellphones and their accessories in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. The use of these devices may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas.

When driving, do not use your cellphone and headphone to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your cellphone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your cellphone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area,

- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the car's electronic devices are shielded from cellphone RF energy.

CONDITIONS OF USE:

You are advised to switch off the cellphone from time to time to optimize its performance.

Remember to abide by local authority rules of cellphone use on aircrafts. Operational Warnings: Obey all posted signs when using mobile devices in public areas.

Follow Instructions to Avoid Interference Problems: Turn off your mobile device in any location where posted notices instruct you to do so. In an aircraft, turn off your mobile device whenever instructed to do so by airline staff. If your mobile device offers an airplane mode or similar feature, consult airline staff about using it in flight.

The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is -10° C (14° F) to $+55^{\circ}$ C (131° F)(the max value depends on device, materials and housing paint/texture).

Over $55^{\circ}C$ (131°F) the legibility of the cellphone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.

Do not open or attempt to repair your cellphone yourself.

Do not drop, throw or try to bend your cellphone.

Do not use the cellphone if the glass made screen, is damaged, cracked or broken to avoid any injury.

Do not paint it.

Use only batteries, battery chargers, and accessories which are recommended by TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates and are compatible with your cellphone model.

TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates disclaim any liability for damage caused by the use of other chargers or batteries.

Your cellphone should not be disposed of in a municipal waste. Please check local regulations for disposal of electronic products.

Remember to make back-up copies or keep a written record of all important information stored in your cellphone.Some people may suffer epileptic seizures or blackouts when exposed to flashing lights, or when playing video games. These seizures or blackouts may occur even if a person never had a previous seizure or blackout.
